Unlike many other 22 foot sailboats that are designed for day sailing, the Rhodes 22 can be classified as a Pocket Cruiser. Overnight and weeklong trips are possible. This boat is on the Great Lakes, the Caribbean, and has been used Off Shore. When you wish for new places to explore, just trailer her to that location. The shallow draft allows taking her into areas that restrict fixed keel boats. The trailer reduces dockage cost and increases peace of mind by providing storage nearby your residence. The Rhodes community (Rhodes22-list) is an active source of information and sounding board for issues and concerns.
